

S O M E W H E R E / ANYWHERE / EVERYWHERE / NOWHERE

In diesem Artikel geht es um einen für Deutschsprachige verblüffenden Aspekt von "somewhere / anywhere / everywhere / nowhere", nämlich um deren Verwendung als Pronomen. Heißt "somewhere" nicht "irgendwo"? Ist "irgendwo" nicht ein Adverb? Haben wir nicht gelernt z.B.: "The village must be somewhere near the sea" = "Das Dorf muss irgendwo in der Nähe des Meeres liegen"?

Wie erklären sich aber dann Sätze wie "There must be somewhere that sells gluten free bread"? Oder: "You don't have to go to the ends of the earth to find somewhere without a Starbucks, a McDonald's or a megamall"? Oder: "Do you know somewhere less expensive than that"? Wo ist da das "irgendwo"?

Der Verfasser sieht sich in seiner Vermutung, dass die letzteren drei Sätze für Deutschsprachige "verblüffend" erscheinen müssen, bestärkt durch den Umstand, dass die beiden (in Österreich) weitestverbreiteten zweisprachigen Schulwörterbücher von Langenscheidt und Pons "somewhere" nur als Adverb behandeln.

Nach einem kurzen – pflichtschuldigen – Überblick über "somewhere / anywhere / everywhere / nowhere" als Adverb geht es weiter zum Pronomen:

1. "Somewhere" as an adverb

"Somewhere" heißt "irgendwo", mit der Variante "anywhere" für Frage und Verneinung (auch in if-clauses), dazu "everywhere" (= überall) und "nowhere" (= nirgendwo). Schließlich gibt es noch die Alternativen "someplace / anyplace / everyplace" im A.E. Hier einige Beispielsätze:

Let's sit **somewhere** in the middle. I parked my car somewhere near the town hall and started walking home. Somewhere in the back of the restaurant a voice answered him. Can we sleep somewhere else? The place we want must be somewhere near that line. They might have hidden it somewhere near the house. It's inevitable that one day, someone, somewhere will say that I've offended them, and that will be that. The remains of my grandfather, like many others, lie somewhere in Flanders on the battlefield of the Somme. We usually have some music on somewhere in the house. It seems he took a wrong turn somewhere along the way. Put them somewhere you won't lose them. If you've got some extra cash, hide it somewhere a thief would be unlikely to look. I can't bear lying on hot beaches, and since I spend my working life writing about the arts I wanted to go somewhere without too much culture.

I knew every eye in the funeral home was on me, and all I could do was just close my eyes and wish that I was someplace else. The money is going to have to come from someplace. "So I think we're going to pick up what we have left and start over someplace else," she says. A weaker dollar or weather problem someplace in the world will change the prospect for exports and prices in 2017. I have read someplace that the loss of a loved one can be felt as a blessing as well as a tragedy. We cannot have a society in which some dictator someplace can start imposing censorship here in the United States.

We are not going **anywhere**! I heard the front door and when I went out I couldn't see her anywhere. We cannot find something better anywhere. Its effects can be seen more clearly in Poland than anywhere else. Remember there's no safe space: a breach can happen anywhere. I've been told by the BBC that if I make one more offensive remark, anywhere, at any time, I will be sacked. No people anywhere in the world had more need of a doctor. We had no idea we were anywhere near a restaurant. Bullying can happen anywhere to anyone. Why go anywhere to see anyone? Robots can be used anywhere to reduce labour costs. Tomato plants can grow almost anywhere that is warm and a little damp.

They say they cannot afford to live anyplace else. Small wind turbines can be built almost anyplace. I would have followed them anyplace. She would have been hard-pressed to find a home for herself anyplace else. I would be delighted to meet him anyplace, anytime between now and election day. Web sites allow small businesses to conduct their affairs at any time and from anyplace. Caterpillar (CAT) can deliver a spare part for a 75 year-old tractor

anyplace on earth in 48 hours. Asian investors and multinational business people anyplace may find this a useful guide. It can strike anyplace, anytime, and you can't predict it. You could reach up almost anyplace and pick a handful of wild grapes. He can't imagine being anyplace but the city. "I wouldn't be anyplace else," she said. It's the last great independent radio station I know of anyplace in the country. When questioned about the drug death of a 15-year-old girl there, Mr. Goodman responded, "I know, but an under-age girl could die anyplace if she misbehaves". I would never stay anyplace less than two nights.

Everywhere I looked people were kissing each other. Feelings about it are broadly the same everywhere. A model for solving this problem has not been found everywhere in the EU. The European Parliament was overwhelmingly against any cloning, including at the embryo stage, and we believe that it should be made a criminal offence everywhere in the world. The Commission really ought to pay greater attention to ensuring that the same standards are applied everywhere. Signs of drought are everywhere. It costs the same everywhere. The fear is, here and everywhere, that this autumn's hardships are just the beginning. Apply your sunscreen everywhere that will be in direct sunlight. Send your resumé absolutely everywhere that you can send it without being a nuisance. Why is it that everywhere you travel in France you get the same food, with little variation (unlike, say Italy or China)? But honestly, the tram will take you everywhere that matters.

I'm a veteran computer buyer so I usually buy my computers and equipment from computer shows, catalogs, the web just about everyplace but a retail computer store. He hated all the people crowding the streets of Pasadena and Altadena and everyplace else. Tattoos were everywhere, on some concertgoers' feet, on others' foreheads and just about everyplace in between. Small, bored children must accompany their grown-ups just about everyplace. Here in New York, we are blessed to have excellent public spaces, but that is not true everyplace in the world. "There are sick people everyplace," the mayor said. He learned to find strange beauty just about everyplace. You wait, in five years, the technology is getting better, there'll be cameras everyplace... whether you like it or not. There are small minds everyplace. We can't just say everybody can go everyplace and do anything they want. Alas, looks matter in the garden, just as they do everyplace else. We see them everyplace we go. I can remember, everyplace we'd go, the cook would try to outdo the other one. It is only those grumblers that you find everyplace that are never satisfied who start such fabrications. {Everyplace that the cameras monitor, we've had a complete reduction to nothing – no trash, no alcohol, no cigarettes. It's all completely gone.} It may be illegal in the United States but would be legal everyplace that the transaction is to take place.

Nowhere is this more urgently needed than in former Yugoslavia. Nowhere in Mexico – or anywhere else in Latin America – has a matrifocal culture like this come into being. Obama was nowhere on the radar screen four years ago. Even so, I'm getting nowhere with the job search. The responsibility for this state of affairs lies with Brussels and nowhere else. Women are present at the workplace, but they are nowhere to be seen in management. We have nowhere else to go. These attempts have led nowhere. The growing gulf between Saudi Arabia and its more sceptical western partners is nowhere more apparent than in the key area of security and defence cooperation.

Die A.E.-Variante "noplac" ist colloquial und kommt (verschriftlicht) selten vor: He was noplac around the house. Aus diesem Grund wird in der weiteren Folge dieses Artikels auf Beispiele mit "noplac" verzichtet.

2. "Somewhere" as a pronoun

Neben den bekannten Adverben "somewhere / anywhere / everywhere / nowhere" (⇒ 1.) gibt es auch die Pronomen "somewhere / anywhere / everywhere / nowhere" (mitsamt ihren A.E.-Formen "someplace / anyplace / everyplace). Mit dem Adverb "somewhere" haben Deutschsprachige kein Problem, weil es analog funktioniert.

Das Pronomen "somewhere" etc. allerdings lässt sich nicht einfach mit "irgendwo" übersetzen, sondern am besten mit "Ort" für den Bestandteil "-where", also z.B. "Jeder Ort ist fußläufig zu erreichen" für den Satz "Everywhere is within walking distance." Ein "Pronomen" steht ja definitionsgemäß am Platz eines Nomens, und als Nomen passt im Fall des Pronomens "somewhere" etc. meistens das Nomen "place" am besten.

Dass ein Wort (von Deutschsprachigen) meistens nur als Adverb wahrgenommen wird und nicht auch in einer anderen Wortart, dafür gibt es übrigens auch andere Beispiele, z.B. kann "yesterday" auch ein Nomen sein: Yesterday was gloriously springlike, warm and sunny. Yesterday's weather was fine.

Ähnlich "today": Regardless of what today may bring – whether headaches or triumphs – be certain to smile. What is the legal basis for today's debate?

Aber wer käme wohl auf den Gedanken, in "where" ein Pronomen zu vermuten? Doch man sehe: I'm the kind of person who likes to visit new places, but often I have no idea where to go or what will be fun, where is tacky or who offers a good deal, where is beautiful and where is dangerous.

2.1. Pronoun as subject

Somewhere (= *ein Ort*) that can be seen from space must be worth a visit. Somewhere you've never been before would be a good choice. I just want something a bit more manageable and I have a passion for gardening, so somewhere with a garden would be good, too. Somewhere else will have to fill the gap. If humanity is to continue burning fossil fuels in large quantities and yet curb the climate-changing effects of the resulting carbon dioxide, then somewhere other than the atmosphere will have to be found to put that CO₂.

Someplace level is best for a playing field. The best reason for having a storm shelter is the peace of mind you have knowing that someplace safe is available. Where that someplace might be wasn't something he'd thought about, but he suspected he'd know the place when he found it. I know, I could scan each one myself, but I thought maybe someplace might be able to do it more cost / time effectively for me. I was wondering if it is even repairable, how to go about it or if someone or someplace could do it for me.

If **anywhere** (= *Wenn es einen Ort gibt, der ...*) has the experience, the political will and the inventiveness to upset the conventional narrative, it's here. According to the law, anywhere that has more than five children full-time, or one child with special needs, has to register as a school. Anywhere within a bike ride is fine – everyone bikes nowadays. Anywhere you can navigate to is fine. Anywhere you can navigate to is fine. Anywhere you have been or that you have been told about will appear on the map.

Anyplace that has such tall buildings and heavy traffic is obviously an environmental disaster. Anyplace that has a lot of history to it and that has a lot of emotion connected with it is a good area to find spirits. I think anyplace that is serious about its wine list and offers a place to drink wine without having to buy a full meal is entitled to be called a wine bar. {I worked in the steel mills in Sparrows Point, Md., where you had washrooms that said 'white' and 'colored.' Baltimore is not like that now, nor is anyplace in America exactly like that.} Anyplace respectable will do their best to accommodate medical dietary restrictions. Anyplace that's narrow and offers no cover is the last place you want to be when the bullets start flying.

Everywhere is within walking distance if you have the time. (= *Jeder Ort*) Everywhere looked at its best, with the first snow of the year dusting the late fallen amber maple leaves. Everywhere we went was piled with corpses. Everywhere had closed early to prepare for the summer solstice celebrations. The problem with Africa is that everywhere you look makes an incredible photo. While this government has concentrated on London, almost everywhere else has gone to ruin. Everywhere else I've lived has been conventional and I wouldn't want to go back to that life – you know, carpets and Hoovers. There were large trees there and the progress of the moon would not light it up, whereas everywhere else would be clear as noonday. Everywhere that is visible seems to be doing well.

Sure, they said, everyplace has its own set of storms to remember, but this seemed like an awful lot. "Everyplace else is a backwater," Walter Light, an independent oilman in Houston, told me. We've certainly felt the downturn that everyplace else has felt. Pretty soon everyplace will have one. We're getting to the point where everyplace is becoming the same. Good walking shoes are a must, but everyplace that the ship docks will be pretty touristy, so casual will be OK. Everyplace that the enemy had gained a foothold was destroyed. Make sure everyplace that the customer comes across is presentable. Everyplace that the salt water goes is suspect. We're getting to the point where everyplace is becoming the same.

Nowhere (= *Kein Ort*) in Britain can ever guarantee unbroken weeks of warm weather. The Russians kept on bombing the whole city – nowhere in Grozny was safe. Nowhere is safe: drug-related violence now affects Rio's beaches and

wealthy areas. Nero wished to make it look as if nowhere pleased him as much as Rome. I have travelled through war zones from Bosnia to Somalia, but nowhere matches the random menace of Iraq today. Even as Covid-19 spreads across the world, nowhere has replicated the scale and intensity of China's unprecedented lockdown. Nowhere in the south-east felt entirely safe. Actually, as far as I know, nowhere in the world has researched their effectiveness. I know nowhere is safe these days and it is just as likely to happen in London. It is clear that a large part of the Israeli mission is simply to make the point that nowhere is beyond its soldiers' reach. "Nowhere's dangerous if you know what you're doing," says Arthur silkily.

2.2. Pronoun as subject complement (= Prädikatsnomen, Gleichsetzungsglied)

Surely there must be **somewhere** (= *Es muss einen Ort geben*) safer than that? There must be somewhere for him to go. The idea for my Atlas of Remote Islands grew out of my childhood belief that there must be somewhere in the world that is truly beautiful. I use my phone all the time, too, but there has to be somewhere you turn off your phone – where there's silence. There has to be somewhere where our bread is baked. {I don't know where you can get your belly button pierced. There must be somewhere in Esker that does piercing.} Is there somewhere for us put our luggage? And he doesn't fancy camping in his car, so is there somewhere good to stay en route? The wood was a very special place, somewhere worth protecting. If there is somewhere your mind goes when you meditate, now is the time to access that calm. A council spokesperson said: "The latest proposal is that we look at more sites within Swansea to see if there is somewhere suitable for a Gypsy and traveller site." I have had emails from young people asking me if there is somewhere they can play their parents' cast-off rock albums, dragged out of the loft. It is somewhere that gives a lot of people a second chance, particularly mature students. Is there somewhere you think we should go? Here the warehouse becomes somewhere 'fun' and also a place of possibility in a time when no one has any money.

Omaha Beach is someplace I've always wanted to visit, and now I have. For me, a museum is someplace where you go into a great crowd of people and are alone. Around the world, the most reliable place to find a white shark is someplace where there are seals. Make sure sure your playing area or "dungeon" is someplace that you are allowed to loiter around. Your kids will want to spend hours in the sandbox, so make sure it's someplace that is protected from the sun's harmful UV rays. What if there had been someplace that felt like home? If the crate becomes someplace that the dog can retreat to in the spirit of prevention and avoidance, then your toddler and pet can cohabit more safely. A tree lurks in this imagination as something you can be lynched from; a river becomes someplace to dispose your body.

Is there **anywhere** (= *Gibt es einen Ort*) we can go? He settled himself on the bottom stairs, because there didn't seem to be anywhere better to sit. We asked if there was anywhere we could have a beer. There cannot be anywhere more English in landscape, culture or history. Is there anywhere you can find coupons? Is there anywhere I can find a perfect plate of spaghetti around here? Is there anywhere better for you to start? If there is anywhere where people can do him harm, that is the place. Contact a local museum or one dedicated to the Victorian era to see if there is anywhere local you can arrange to have it done. The councils will then decide whether to take part in a search to find out if there is anywhere in the Allerdale or Copeland areas that is suitable for a nuclear waste repository. If there is anywhere that young adult literature should be read, it's schools. {Can we eat somewhere else? – I'm informed there isn't anywhere else.} Is there anywhere close by that I can park my car?

Is there anyplace in particular that you want to see at Cape Canaveral? But I'll tell you the truth, I don't think it's anyplace good. I worked everywhere – the Washington Post, Time, USA Today – and there's never been anyplace with an office culture as vibrant as Newsweek's. I don't know that there's anyplace else you could do that now. We asked if there was anyplace less cold and the waitress took us to a table where there was, in addition to the a/c, a fan. "I'm not sure there's anyplace in the modern world that's sustainable," Mr. Butterfield said. I saw a bobcat on a golf course once, and I don't know that there's anyplace else you could do that now.

"Everywhere" kommt als Prädikatsnomen nicht vor: "Es gibt jeden Ort ... / Es gibt (ein) Überall ..." ergibt keine sinnvollen Sätze.

There is **nowhere** (= *Es gibt keinen Ort*) to park. There is nowhere here to live. Now there is nowhere left to turn. There was nowhere to play for the children near our home. There is nowhere to wash. There was nowhere to put our feet. There was nowhere else to go and so we sat there until morning. They boarded a train, but there was nowhere to sit. There was nowhere for the rainwater to go. There's nowhere in the world like it. The sad reality is that, increasingly, there is nowhere in the city where people really mix. There is nowhere like it on the planet. There's nowhere to go but up. It was exciting because there was nowhere else like it. They know there's nowhere else you guys can go. This is nowhere I can describe exactly, only that it's mysterious and limitless, a place where the mind expands. There was nowhere a rope could possibly be hung. There was nowhere you could play. He said there was nowhere where he felt at home. Sex has long been monetized, and today there's nowhere that the market doesn't go. Is there nowhere that we can watch the football? It was incredibly frustrating that there was nowhere that you could speak to previous students who lived there about their experiences. There is nowhere that you can avoid the cameras. Is there nowhere that you can find Christian sympathy and fellowship? The transition from cordless to cellular went quickly and now, for better or worse, there's nowhere we can't be reached.

2.3. Pronoun as object

Now they have **somewhere** (= *einen Ort*) to live. He needs somewhere to live. You haven't always got somewhere to put your head down. {The apartment was a disaster. He couldn't imagine how they had found somewhere so scruffy.} Bring your sleeping bags and we'll find you somewhere in the house for the night. I'll fix up somewhere for him to hide for a few days. Do you have somewhere we could store our luggage? Foreigners were happy to have somewhere in Paris where they could change money for a reasonable price. We had to feed them and give them somewhere to stay. They are given help finding somewhere to live. Once the house is sold, I will have to find somewhere else to live. Now we had to find somewhere else to hide. The Victorians gave birth to the idea of a "winter garden" as they needed somewhere to show off the newly discovered tropical plants they were bringing back from all corners of the globe. "I am building a counselling shelter at my house," he says, "so that people have somewhere to come to speak to me". Find somewhere that is supervised by a lifeguard. I know their stadium only holds 6,000 so I think they will need to find somewhere with a few more seats than that. He was fairly confident that they would find somewhere without too much difficulty. Hopefully the restaurant will reopen or I'll find somewhere else to work. Any small island with beaches facing in all directions will have somewhere to surf. We wanted somewhere that's actually pleasant to be. We need somewhere that's good for the children but also somewhere Lisa can manage on limited energy. Now they will have somewhere to hang their hats when in town.

Do we have someplace to go? In Germany's extensive vocational education system, employers are obliged by law to set aside a certain ratio of apprenticeships, so students will have someplace to go after they graduate. Along with the thousands of others now taking refuge in school buildings, Ismael's family will have to find someplace else to live. He must be sorry he directed "Deal of the Century," or he'd have found someplace in the book to mention it. With less than two weeks until the Coachella music festival, the traditional last-minute panic to book someplace to stay is pushing hotel room prices up. He also needed to find someplace to eat in a city where the homeless shelters were closed and there seemed to be little demand to house those displaced by the storm. Choose either a cool day, or a time of day that will be cooler, or someplace in your yard that will be cooler – or all three.

You could offer me **anywhere** (= *jeden beliebigen Ort*) in the world at this moment and I wouldn't go. They support those who do not have anywhere to live. We haven't found anywhere yet to hang the hammock from. It's often quite impossible to find anywhere to park. He cannot find anywhere to hide. I couldn't find anywhere to plug in my shaver. Very few had anywhere else to go. It's hard to find anywhere to move. We have logistical limitations such as not having anywhere to land and park more planes. Can't imagine anywhere having a better atmosphere than Clermont, but didn't go there this season. It is difficult to imagine anywhere else in America where this industry has a larger presence. It's hard to imagine anywhere more romantic than Lucca in the spring. Never had I seen anywhere less gloomy.

They have never known anyplace else. I don't know anyplace where a private water company was in business and the city went into direct competition with them. Him and his dog were trying to find anyplace the dog could get off and pee. They feel they have no stake in their countries of birth, but have never known anyplace else and have

nowhere to "return" to. Anyplace he went, he lit it up with his spirit. I just can't imagine anyplace more fantastic than where we were last night! I can't imagine anyplace else that would be as fulfilling as Swarthmore. The advantage to living in Iowa (yes, there is one) is that you can choose anyplace, and there is really nothing guiding your decision other than your own curiosities. Where would you go if you could choose anyplace you wanted?

{The fellows in the band will take you around a bit. They know **everywhere** (= *jeden Ort*) in the town.} God knows everywhere you go. He said: "I inspect everywhere that can be safely accessed. You'll get to know everywhere like the back of your hand. Google wants to know everywhere that you're looking. I know everywhere you've got cell phone coverage and where you don't have cell phone coverage. I don't like it, but I hate everywhere else, too. I hate everywhere that isn't my home! I like everywhere with traditional carvings and woven wall panels and centre poles of elaborately carved figures. After thinking long and hard about a place he could dislike, he stated, "I don't know, I like everywhere that I've been so far." He says that there are not enough staff members to watch everywhere that needs to be watched.

It's just that I hate everyplace else. Because we don't know everyplace you plan to use the Vienna Card, we can't do the math for you. I think I know everyplace that you've been. Our drivers know everyplace of the French Riviera. Sarah could remember everyplace she'd ever gone dancing in her life. After a day I was able to find everyplace I wanted. Everyplace that the sole of your foot will tread upon I have given you, as I said to Moses. (Joshua 1, 3) He knows everyplace around here, even the bad stuff. Remember that Orange knows everyplace you visited given that you had network coverage!

Since 1947 they had lived in London but had **nowhere** (= *keinen Ort*) of their own. He gave his hotel room to a friend who had nowhere to stay. They had no money, no clothes and nowhere to go. Money was the least of my problems; I knew nowhere to go. He knows nowhere else where purity is available on such reasonable terms. Youngsters today often have nowhere to play. We have nowhere in the world to turn to. I had nowhere to sleep. I know nowhere that allows you to essentially be your own boss and to work in the clinic as though you own it yourself. They feel they have no stake in their countries of birth, but have never known anyplace else and have nowhere to "return" to.

Analog: The Iraqis still have enough biological weapons material to blow away Tel Aviv or wherever.

2.4. Pronoun as prepositional object

We searched for **somewhere** (= *einen Ort*) to get lunch. I looked for somewhere to sit down. She looked around for somewhere to put her empty lunchbox. We strolled through the centre of town looking for somewhere to eat. I looked for somewhere to get a cold drink. The pilot looked around for somewhere to land and spotted a cornfield. The pilot had to look for somewhere safe to land. East Kent has not, so far, been transformed by the Eurotunnel into somewhere booming and cosmopolitan. I was not keen to get back to somewhere I had spent so much time trying to get away from. They gave him a rail pass to somewhere called Mablethorpe. I'd like to move out of London, to somewhere like Felixstowe, where it's quiet and there's a community.

Aspen is often regarded as someplace not for the masses. What we would like to do is use it as someplace to be shared. The protesters say they want to make sure that if offsets [= Ausgleichsflächen] are purchased in someplace like Acre, Brazil, no indigenous people are forced off the land when the forest becomes a protected area. If somebody wants to get into someplace bad enough, they will. . Northeast Key sounds like someplace you might holiday if Miami's just getting too expensive. As much like someplace on the Lower East Side as you'll find in Paris, it has mismatched and painted tables and chairs, a painted floor and a teeny tiny open kitchen. A drifting kid comes upon a ghostly town in the baking hot badlands of someplace in the West, Nevada perhaps, or Arizona. Think of someplace other than where you are at. It always comes out of someplace you never expected. Romney said the supplies would be trucked to someplace in New Jersey, even though the Red Cross says random shipments of food create a logistical headache for relief workers. It's nice to go to someplace that is not your home, but feels like your home.

He was incapable of giving exact topographical information about **anywhere** (= *über irgendeinen Ort*). They are not fit for anywhere except prison. With modern-day transport, we get fresh ingredients from anywhere in France. It isn't like anywhere I've been. Can you think of anywhere we haven't looked? "I don't know of anywhere like this," effuses

a 28-year-old woman who bought a flat 18 months ago. Cardiff saw the greatest population rise of anywhere in Wales, growing by 12%. Back in Hackney, house prices rose 20 per cent in the year preceding January 2014, the highest of anywhere in the capital. The pattern of immigration into San Francisco during the latter half of the 19th century was significantly different from that of anywhere else in the United States. Over the past few years Hyderabad has produced more software engineers than anywhere in India. Cyprus has elicited more UN resolutions than anywhere else in the world. The area is the most biologically diverse in the Mediterranean, and has up to four times more dolphins and whales than anywhere else in the basin. Britain provides fewer publicly funded child-care centers than anywhere else in Europe. Demographically, Italy is transforming faster than almost anywhere in Europe. India, a nation with more religions and believers than almost anywhere else, is a secular state. At that point, wire transfers could have been sent out "to the tune of several hundred million dollars" to anywhere in the world. I'm almost invariably in love with anywhere that I get to spend more than three days. Just as with anywhere, leave the extra jewelry and flamboyant clothes at home. Why bother with anywhere else?

It is separated by a hundred miles of desert from anyplace else. For a woman who traveled with designer suitcases and wore boots with skinny heels, she didn't seem to mind pulling into anyplace less grand than San Francisco. I don't know of anyplace that teaches patrol cops as much as we do. Forty years ago there was the largest concentration of manufacturing and distribution here of anyplace in the United States. "I can't think of anyplace that is as much fun," he added. If any building built before 1860 in the South, and many after, was "built on the backs of slaves," then perhaps a plantation is no worse than anyplace else. The silent sniper fire of overdoses from pills and heroin has hit Staten Island harder than anyplace else in the city. You point and zoom to anyplace on the planet that you want to explore. The country is so unlike anyplace we know in landscape and language, that it is possible to feel protective of it in ways that Icelanders themselves sometimes find encumbering.

Take pictures of everything, write about **everywhere** (= *jeden Ort*) you stop. You need to think about everywhere you spend time. They collect detailed data about everywhere that each member of the household travels during a specific day. He'd be swallowed by London, squashed by everywhere else. That's with the exception of those "nine coffees and you get one free" cards that you are given by everywhere from McDonald's to the staff canteen. I collect stickers from everywhere that sells them. Think of everywhere you went since you lost the item. He wanted to keep the memory of everywhere he had traveled. "People from everywhere donated money," she said. There are people coming from everywhere across the country. The children call themselves "third-culture kids," meaning they're from everywhere and nowhere. He's come in from nowhere. Sometimes, bad news can appear from nowhere.

"It's inevitable that people will want to go to Antarctica because they've taken too much fish from everywhere else," says James Barnes, executive director of the Antarctic and Southern Ocean Coalition. Jackson Hole, Wyoming, is a long way from anyplace. It can deliver video to the home, connections to the Internet, and voice circuits from and to anyplace on earth. I lament the fact that, before long, the region will be just like everywhere else. I love how much Québec City looks like someplace in Europe!

Go somewhere you will all enjoy. Go somewhere you know that he likes. Try to find a suitable location, perhaps somewhere you both used to love? Choose somewhere you can walk to, and invite friends. Post the schedule somewhere you can see, like your bedroom door or wall. It's not somewhere one would choose to be ill. Birds prefer feeders close to cover like bushes or trees, but not somewhere a cat can reach, like near a wall or fence. I also think the discovery of somewhere you don't know is so exciting.

It always comes out of someplace you never expected. It is food sourced from someone or someplace I do not personally know. America may think it does not have any interests in Syria, but it has interests **everywhere** the Syrian conflict touches. Spiders are everywhere I know, even here at home. Subway has expanded everywhere one can think of with outlets in hospitals, bus terminals, colleges, stores and railway stations etc.

It could be a destination (or several), it could be a specific type of cuisine, it could be somewhere whose food surprised you, despite its humble ingredients, it could be a particular restaurant ...} It was so nice staying somewhere whose owners also have a young family, so understand your needs ...

It might be someplace whose laws don't recognize the authority of that court – say, Beijing. Ein solches "that" funktioniert wie ein Synonym von "where" – aus diesem Grund definiert man solche mit "that" eingeleiteten Nebensätze wohl besser als "local clauses / clauses of place" und nicht als Relativsätze:

Now look and see if there are any bare bits on your wall or **somewhere that** a nice picture or just something would go. Then, simply slip it somewhere that a friend or family member will find it and wait for them to do the work! Be aware that it is unsafe for un-vaccinated people to even be somewhere that a person with measles has been recently. Sit on the floor or somewhere that the pup won't be harmed if it jumps out of your hand. You'll need to place it somewhere that the family can see it daily. If you are going to be anywhere that a potential client may be, make sure you are ready to talk to them. Hi, is there anywhere that a list of new updates or tweaks for the assistant can be found? Is there anywhere that the full study was published? Is there anywhere that the climate HAS changed radically in the last 50 years? I can't find anywhere that the code 256 is defined. I did a bit of research and I can't find anywhere that the NBA takes a stance on their players' smoking habits. Was there anywhere that the police might not have looked? Theoretically, an OTEC plant can be built anywhere that the ocean has a surface temperature above 25°C and is more than 1km deep. Make sure that you will not be anywhere that your friend or someone who may relay information to your friend might also be. Home is anywhere that you find peace and comfort. Yes, you must stop anywhere that the police ask you to stop.

The football team didn't go anyplace that our three black players couldn't go. It is a mistake to think there is anyplace that our children go that won't include drugs and alcohol. I never traveled anyplace that my oboe didn't take me. I won't be buried anyplace that my kids and grandkids can't bike to. Suffice it to say that my two favourite non-urban parts of America are the southern coasts of Mississippi and Alabama and the coast of Maine north of, say, Rockland, but really I am happy anyplace that people fish for a living. You can plant them near the house, under a shade tree, or anywhere that you can't grow the more heat-tolerant veggies that love full sun. Well, I would walk, and I thought that the moon went anyplace that I did. I thought you said you wouldn't go digging anyplace that you didn't need to. Bezogen auf Ortsangaben kann "where" ein Relativpronomen sein, z.B.: Is that the place where you were born? Man erkennt diese Zuordnung zu den Relativpronomen u.a. daran, dass vor "where" die Beistrichregeln für "defining and non-defining relative clauses" gelten, also z.B. Beistrich in: We will head through Green Park to Buckingham Palace, where we'll watch the world-famous Changing of the Guard ceremony.

In den folgenden Sätzen mit "where" muss man grammatikalisch differenzieren – zwar sind "somewhere" etc. in den grün markierten Beispielen Pronomen, in den nicht markierten jedoch Adverbien. Man könnte die nicht markierten Beispiele als "adverb + local clause" interpretieren nach dem Muster von: Put it over there where you can find it. The car was there where it was supposed to be. It is right here where we live. It is here where the trouble started. The stats are up where we need to be. Hold the blind up where you want it.

Es gibt auch unklare Fälle: There are so many places I could take them, but it would have to be somewhere where I have the only access to. Man kann das interpretieren als "It would have to be a place where ..." (⇒ Pronomen) oder als "It would have to be at a place where ..." (⇒ Adverb).

Go somewhere where you can be alone. I just wanted to go somewhere where I'd feel comfortable. Ed Miliband points to Ireland as somewhere where the policy has worked. We want to leave this region and go somewhere where there is peace. It's somewhere where you never thought you would be when you were a kid. The body is somewhere where the police don't have the money to dig. Put the alarm clock somewhere where you will have to get up to turn it off. It is a question of waiting to die in these cases, but death could be so infinitely more comfortable if there were only somewhere where these people could be ... This is somewhere where kids can hang out and they've got something to do.

People (and undocumented immigrants may not be Americans, but they are still people) do not uproot themselves from their country and family to go someplace where they don't speak the language and get paid peanuts just for the fun of it. In fact, mint does grow kind of like a weed – you need to be careful to plant it someplace where it will be contained, if not in a pot, at least in a part of the garden where its spread will be limited. Can you imagine living someplace where you had to grow your own parsley? We just want to go someplace where we can relax and shut down. "We just need someplace where we can be a family," Ms. Adams said. But I liked the idea of going someplace where we would need a reservation, so I said yes. Keep it somewhere you can see it. Is there somewhere I can play? If only there was somewhere I could turn for answers. I want to be somewhere I can make my own name. You have to choose somewhere the story happens. Have somewhere the child can read in quiet. The consumers, it seemed, wanted to go somewhere the industry was reluctant to lead. Maybe go somewhere the teachers don't know you at all. Put it somewhere the children couldn't

find it. But now he was lost, somewhere she couldn't follow him. A weed is simply a plant which is somewhere a human doesn't want it. His penis is somewhere a penis really shouldn't be. Head for somewhere you feel comfortable. Never hang out somewhere you feel unsafe. Put them somewhere you won't lose them. It's somewhere you don't want to be. **Is there somewhere you think we should go?** If you've got some extra cash, hide it somewhere a thief would be unlikely to look. If you go somewhere one of you has already been, the dynamic becomes one of guide and tourist, which is not a partnership of equals. **It feels like somewhere you'd like an hour or two alone to rummage round. Whole communities have uprooted themselves in search of somewhere they feel safe. A good example of somewhere wind power is working is Denmark.**

Maybe it would be better to go someplace we hadn't worked before. **That looks like someplace he might be. This also doesn't sound like someplace one would want to live. Acorns can be found anywhere where there is a great oak tree. **I can't think of anywhere else in Westchester where you can eat like this at these prices.**

I don't know anyplace where a private water company was in business and the city went into direct competition with them. I wouldn't want to coach anyplace where they didn't expect to win. Consumers today will go anyplace where somebody knows them and where somebody makes it easy. **I won't go to anyplace where there's a huge gathering.**

Contact clauses: They didn't take us anywhere we hadn't already been. Set tables anywhere you have extra space. Anywhere the manager asks me to play, I will play and give my best. You'll need a Myanmar visa, available anywhere the country has an embassy. The club could be anywhere in the world, anywhere the new rich live. **He couldn't think of anywhere he wanted to go. Registered sex offenders in Georgia are barred from living within 1,000 feet of anywhere children may congregate, such as a school, a park, a library, or a swimming pool. Pretend to go on vacation with your teddy bears or stuffed animals to anywhere you like. Dún Laoghaire was not quite like anywhere I had been before. I can't think of anywhere else we would do this.**

I don't have to be anyplace I don't want to be. I will do it anyplace I can get away with it, where I know there isn't a camera following me. Anyplace you look there are holes. The implants, which are made from surgical steel, titanium, or gold, can be done anyplace skin is loose enough to be pinchable: not just on the forehead but on the back of the hand and in other, more gruesome spots. **Magazines, bus stops, taxicabs — anyplace they thought women might see the "Sak Lady" icon was fair game. Waves are **everywhere where** there is good wind speed. Everywhere where fashion is, I want to be there, and I see myself making it. The communication infrastructure is the foundation for "smart" devices and will be everyplace where the SmartGrid exists. Ethernet connections are found everyplace where high-speed-data transfer is a necessity. Resistant bacteria are found everyplace where there

is exposure to antibacterial agents. They want the program to include music from everyplace in the world where cocoa grows.

Contact clauses: I'm now hearing it everywhere I go. Use water as a supplement for soda, carry it everywhere you might get the temptation to drink a soda. This freakish ideal is everywhere we look. We had mixed experiences everywhere we went. Everywhere you looked in the Kuikuro village "you can see the past in the present". Throughout the community there's a tension that there's something on the horizon and you feel that everywhere you go. It seems that everywhere you look, you see one popping up. I love the vintage wooden number 28 tram that takes you everywhere you'll want to go. So, we ask ourselves: how do we get the people of Boston to everywhere they'd want to go? In fact, let's apply this to everywhere you go: If the distance is less than a few miles, you should walk. So I've brought this with me to everywhere I've been.

We were bringing ice from all over the place — California, Portland, everyplace we could buy it. It didn't use it in the hotel, but I used it pretty much everyplace else I ventured while in the city. It has maps for everyplace you'd want to go. A friend of mine Googled my name and came up with a whole bunch of information of everyplace I have lived in the last 20 years. They followed me everyplace I went. Everyplace I looked, without exception, students were plugged in, multi-tasking and distracted from the opportunities and people surrounding them. The dog left a warm, wet, puddle of pee everyplace the baby sat.

I was there or thereabouts, but nowhere where I wanted to be. Our mindset was nowhere where it should've been, let's put it that way. We're nowhere where we're not wanted. There is nowhere that you can go where I will not find you. It seems when you carry an Iridium phone, there is nowhere on the planet where your mother cannot reach you.

Contact clauses: There's nowhere I haven't looked. There was nowhere I could go. There's nowhere I can work for the near future, so I don't know what else to do. There was nowhere a rope could possibly be hung. There is nowhere you can do that but at Yeshiva. There's nowhere you can taste that, unless you make it yourself. There was nowhere you could play. If you want your partner to pay attention to you, screaming "divorce!" will likely get you nowhere you want to be. There is nowhere you can find rest. Math "is nowhere you can find it, far beyond the logic of space and time." There is nowhere you can study. There is nowhere you can go and only be with the people who are like you. It was like nowhere I'd ever been before.

Hopefully the restaurant will reopen or I'll find somewhere else to work. But she wouldn't mind somewhere a little more comfortable to sleep at night. I really like living in Maida Vale but it would be nice to find somewhere a little bigger. He deserves somewhere a little more understated, where the emphasis is on the food rather than the interiors.
